School Extension Delay

Four construction bids for the school extension project have recently been received, as organized by the Archdiocese of Boston, for consideration by Our Lady's Parish. The submitted prices of the bids have come in higher than our savings and budget permits for summer construction.

It is in the best interest of the parish, and thus the parish school, to postpone construction of the project until a more likely start date of next summer. While it is certain the project would enhance our parish school, it is more financially prudent at this time to postpone the project. During the upcoming months the parish will continue working with the archdiocese and our architect, Joe Fournier, to review in further detail the current construction plan. This would enable us to take the necessary time to make some modifications to the current plan and also add to our school's savings for the project. An early-winter construction bidding process would most likely place us in a more competitive time-frame as companies plan ahead for their summer work.

Much time and effort has been placed into this proposed development project, which will not be lost as we continue to plan toward the future, balanced by continued use of sound financial judgment. I join Mrs. Minor in extending the appreciation of the parish to all who have been involved in this nearly two year process as we strive to advance the mission of our church and school for the glory of God and outreach to God's people. May the intercession of Mary, our mother, continue to assist us on our journey through life.
